### ***What should I do as a KGP liaison?***

1. Make an appointment to meet in person or *via* e-mail with the administrator designated to work with Kappa Gamma Pi on campus. This may be a vice president, academic dean, director of student services, director of honor societies or someone else whom we list as contact person. We suggest that you make this appointment as soon as possible while the academic year is still “young.” In spring, college schedules get very hectic and administrators do not have time available for meeting.
2. Read over the suggested “script” to prepare for your meeting. Read the enclosed KGP brochure for background information
3. Be aware of the specific “statistics” related to your own college, *i.e.*, did the administration nominate new members this year? Did they award the Saint Catherine medal? Do they use honor cords for recognition?
4. Arrive for your meeting with a confident, positive attitude! Your personal communications with the administrator can project the image of a strong, growing organization with a rich history and a vital future.
5. Select specific topics from our script to mention at a first meeting. Don’t try to cover all material at one meeting. Be prepared to answer questions regarding the Cornaro Scholarship, the Saint Catherine Medal and the National Literacy Project. Other ideas for discussion topics can be found in issues of the *KGP NEWS* and the Kappa Keynotes.
6. Please remember that this is a dialogue – not an interview! We want to share our goals, our activities, our mission with the college. How can we help? What can we do to make the nomination process easier? Ask the administrator to post the bulletin board information card in a prominent location.
7. If you have other questions before your meeting, contact your Chapter President, Regent or the KGP National Office.
8. After your meeting, fill out Liaison Report forms and return them to the KGP National Office *via* either regular mail or e-mail.

## **Liaison Meeting Script**

### ***What is Kappa Gamma Pi?***

Kappa Gamma Pi was founded 81 years ago in 1926 as an honor society for outstanding lay women graduates of Catholic colleges. Over the years membership criteria have been expanded to permit the nomination of men, members of religious communities, college administrators and alumnae(i). A college or university may nominate baccalaureate degree, master's degree or Ph.D. degree graduates.

### ***What is Kappa's Mission?***

Kappa Gamma Pi, the National Catholic College Graduate Honor Society, exemplifies excellence in leadership, scholarship, faith and service.

### ***What advantages does Kappa affiliation offer to our colleges?***

Kappa is 80 years old, with a prestigious history of leadership and service. Almost 48,000 honor graduates of Kappa colleges have been nominated to Kappa membership. Members live all over the world. The goal of achieving Kappa membership upon graduation is an incentive to students to develop and encourage scholarship and leadership skills. Kappas are eligible for the Cornaro Scholarship. Kappa offers organizational support for Catholic higher education. Reprint rights for lecture and seminar materials are available for *KGP NEWS* articles.

### ***What is the Saint Catherine Medal?***

The Saint Catherine Medal is an annual student award presented at Kappa affiliates. The medal may be awarded to an undergraduate, graduate or non-traditional student who represents the high ideals of a Catholic college education. The medal is available in four metallic finishes and may be engraved or not, depending on the wishes of the administration. Medals are purchased from the KGP National Office.

### ***How do you nominate a person for a Saint Catherine Medal?***

The recipient is selected by the college staff and faculty based on demonstration of leadership and service. This student does NOT have to have the GPA necessary for graduation with honors. Some Saint Catherine Medal recipients go on to become KGP members at graduation; others do not.

### ***What is the Cornaro Scholarship?***

The Cornaro Scholarship for Graduate Studies was established in 1984 for members of Kappa Gamma Pi who have been accepted by an accredited university and will begin or continue graduate studies. Currently the award is \$3000, nonrenewable, and the stipend may be applied as needed for any graduate expenses. The scholarship is named for Elena Lucrezia Cornaro Piscopia, the first woman to earn a university degree in 1678.

### ***How does one qualify for the Cornaro Scholarship?***

One must be a member of Kappa Gamma Pi and have been accepted into an accredited graduate program. The scholarship award is based on the following criteria: academic achievement, volunteer service, leadership activities and financial need.

***How does a graduate acquire a scholarship application?***

All Kappa affiliated colleges and universities receive a supply of Cornaro Scholarship application blanks in early November. These forms are sent both to the Kappa contact on campus and to the Financial Aid Office. Please use ONLY the current 2008 scholarship forms. All previous years' forms are obsolete. Forms are also available from the KGP National Office.

***Where do you send the application forms after they are completed?*** Applications, with all accompanying documentation, must be sent or e-mailed to the National II Vice President, by April 21, 2008. Name and addresses are on the 2008 form.

***When is the best time for our college to nominate new members to Kappa?***

After the completion of seven semesters (therefore, during the last semester before graduation), students who have attained a GPA sufficient for graduation with honors and have demonstrated outstanding leadership abilities, may be nominated by the administration. Complete packets of nomination forms are mailed to all affiliates in early January.

By completing the nomination process early in the semester, the college gives the KGP National Office time to process the new members, prepare personalized membership certificates and return them to the college for presentation at a special ceremony, honors convocation or other such academic event. This is much better than having the college send the nominations AFTER graduation when it is impossible to honor the nominees on campus. Kappa needs the visibility that on-campus presentations and awards engender.

***Should we purchase KGP honor cords?***

KGP honor cords are a very attractive mahogany brown and ivory twist with tassels. When worn with academic cap and gown on our campuses, the cords offer a distinctive way to identify Kappa graduates and Kappa faculty members. Cords may be purchased in any quantity from the KGP National Office. The administrator should request an order form.
